Ingredients:

- 25ml corn starch
- 25ml margarine
- 250ml whole milk
- 375ml chicken broth
- 250ml cooked potatoes
- 3ml crushed garlic
- 1ml dried oregano
- 1ml dried basil
- 2 slices bacon, cooked and chopped (this will be divided for toppings)
- 200ml cheddar cheese, shredded (divided)
- 2 green onions, chopped (divided)

Directions:

- In a medium saucepan, melt margarine and create a roux by adding the corn starch.
- Add milk and chicken broth and bring to a boil.
- Meanwhile, cook the strips of bacon and crumble or chop the bacon into small pieces.
- Let liquid boil for 3-4 minutes, then add the potatoes, garlic, oregano, and basil. Boil for 5 minutes.
- Add half of the bacon, half of the cheddar cheese and half of the green onions to the soup and reserve the other half for toppings.
- Cook soup for another 3-4 minutes stirring occasionally so the cheese melts.
- Serve soup topped with cheese, bacon, and green onions.
