Assessment Guidelines

There are various purposes for assessment:

- Assessment *for* learning (**formative assessment**): where assessment helps teachers gain insight into what students understand in order to plan and guide instruction and provide helpful feedback to students.
- Assessment *as* learning (**formative assessment**): is characterized by students reflecting on their own learning and making adjustments so that they achieve deeper understanding.
- Assessment *of* learning (**summative assessment**): where assessment informs students, teachers and parents, as well as the broader educational community, of achievement at a certain point in time in order to celebrate success, plan interventions and support continued progress.

General Learning Outcomes

Students will:

- Listen to understand the communicated message. Communicate orally and interact spontaneously keeping in mind the message, fluency and accuracy.
- Read a variety of texts, for various purposes, and demonstrate understanding orally, in writing or visually.
- Plan and write coherent texts to communicate the message.
- Demonstrate a general knowledge of both francophone cultures and the advantages of learning French. Apply knowledge of francophone cultures to interactions with others (intercultural).

UNITS OF STUDY 3-4 weeks per unit

1. Star Chart: Creating a tableau/story from personalized questions and answers PQA

Formative Assessment: quick quizzes, written responses, class discussions, other

2. Star Chart: Creating a tableau/story from a One Word Image

Formative Assessment: quick quizzes, written responses, class discussions, other

3. Star Chart: Creating a tableau/story from an Individually Created Image

Formative Assessment: quick quizzes, written responses, class discussions, other

4. Voces digital textbook, stories, and more

Topics will flexibly supplement our StarChart work in class

6. Daily Reading in the target language

A wide range of books in the French language are available to students for reading on a daily basis. We work up to 10 minutes sustained silent reading in French.

5. Final Project (no exam)

Students will have some choice and will present (in French) on a topic chosen by the teacher which varies year by year. Students will be provided some class time and resources to complete their projects successfully.

IMPORTANT

Academic Honesty

- It is expected that the work you hand in is your own from the current school semester/class. Students found copying from a classmate, another source (online or otherwise), or submits other's ideas as their own, is plagiarizing, or cheating and will result in an automatic "zero" on the assignment.
