Course Title: Exploration of Collision Repair and Refinishing Technology

Course Description:

This unit provides students with an overview of the Collision Repair trade and explores various career options. Students will receive basic instruction in: shop operation, safety, welding and minor damage repair, paint preparation, and detailing.

- Explain the role of Auto Body Repair Shops and Insurance Companies in repairing collision-damaged vehicles
- Outline various career paths and apprenticeship training
- Follow shop safety policies and procedures
- Perform basic MIG welding on sheet metal

- Prepare panels for painting
- Detail vehicles
