

Dear Parent Council,

As Grade 8 teachers, we feel it is important to give our students a fun (and curricular!) field trip in their final year as Waverly Park Students. We have planned a field trip to Winnipeg for all Grade 8 students for June 4th, 2026, before exam preparation and tests begin. We have planned a photographic scavenger hunt at the Assiniboine Zoo where we will apply science concepts about biomes and ecosystems in teams of ten. After lunch there, we will travel to Activate West to play collaborative games that align with our physical education curriculum. We plan to be gone with 62 Grade 8 students and at least seven adult chaperones from about 7:45am until 5:30p.m. To make this happen, we require two buses from outside the school division. We booked Compass Coach Lines, and the bill came out to \$2700. In the interest of keeping this field trip accessible for everyone, we are asking for your consideration to help with the cost of our transportation.
